2.1.6 EXTERNAL EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLANS / MUTUAL AID

Canadian Natural maintains emergency response support / mutual aid understandings with local authorities impacted by this ERP and information from these understandings are included in the sections below. These understandings are maintained by annual consultations; consultation forms are filed separately with the Emergency Management group and are not included in this plan. Consultation forms are used to:

- Collect contact information for emergency notification and updating purposes
- Inform government / agency / emergency responder of Canadian Natural practices and procedure to be followed
- Make available relevant information consistent with that which is specified in our Emergency Response Plan (ERP) to the government / agency / emergency responder
- Clarify roles, responsibilities and capabilities of both parties, including support and / or additional aid from agency
- Inform the government / agency / emergency responder of the potential hazards of Canadian Natural facilities
- Inform government / agency / emergency responder of Canadian Natural's risk controls and mitigation activities
- Collect the authorization signature of the relevant agency representative

2.1.6.1 External Emergency Response Plans - Local Municipalities

2.1.6.1.1 Peace River Regional District (PRRD)

The Peace River Regional District will be notified at any time an emergency occurs that involves the evacuation of residents. It is essential that Canadian Natural's Incident Commander or designate maintain communication with PRRD's Protective Services Manager to ensure that responses are coordinated.

The PPRD has a formal Emergency Management Plan, which outlines the measures and sources of assistance that can be obtained to support emergency response efforts, within their jurisdictional boundaries. Upon request from the BC Energy Regulator (BCER), the Regional District may address emergency response capabilities, expectations and preparedness. If required or requested, the Regional District may activate their emergency plan in order to achieve any of the following:

- Work with the BCER's Emergency Operation Centre (EOC) if established
 - o With remote support as a cooperating agency through the BCER Liaison Officer and/or,
 - o In the BCER operations section as an assisting agency
- Provide support and assistance to ensure notifications of endangered area residents
 - Mass Alerting
 - Notifications
- Provide support to coordinate the delivery of Emergency Support Services (ESS) to evacuated or effected residents
- If necessary, declaration of a State of Local Emergency to enact legislative powers including but not limited to:
 - o Issuance of Evacuation Alerts, Orders and Rescinds (persons, livestock, and animals)
 - Acquire or use any land or personal property considered necessary to prevent, respond or alleviate the effects of an event (following BCEMS Model); and
 - o Control or Prohibit Travel in the region for safety
- Assist in a public information service (joint, BCER, Industry and local government)
- Assist with the provision of building re-entry procedures jointly with utility providers, industry, Northern Health, and Technical Safety BC.

Emergency Services / Equipment:

Fire Services – The PRRD provides enhanced 9-1-1 Emergency Services to all municipalities and electoral areas of the Regional District. The 9-1-1 Emergency Services also includes fire / rescue radio dispatch for eleven fire departments throughout the region; the fire dispatch center is located on Vancouver Island

Road Maintenance – All Road maintenance in the PRRD is the responsibility of the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure (MOTI) North and South Peace District.

Local Law Enforcement

County Enforcement Services - All Police Services in the PRRD are under the responsibility of the local RCMP detachments, and available via 911

Community Peace Officers / Bylaw Officers: None

2.1.6.1.2 Municipal District of Greenview (AB)

Any time an emergency occurs that involves the evacuation of more people than Canadian Natural personnel can handle, the MD of Greenview will be notified to assist. If necessary, the MD will then declare a local state of emergency and take over the evacuation process, including activating and manning their own Reception Centre and sending Municipal District personnel / volunteers to manage an evacuation. It is essential that Canadian Natural's Incident Commander or designate maintain communication with the Municipal District's Manager Protective Services to ensure that responses are coordinated.

The MD has an Emergency Response Plan (ERP). Their emergency number is included in the Municipal Contacts Section of Canadian Natural's ERP. They can be called to assist Canadian Natural with any emergency notifications, evacuations or procedures that may be required.

There are three Greenview Fire Departments located at DeBolt, Grande Cache and Grovedale, two Fire Departments on contract from Fox Creek, Grande Cache and Valleyview, each with approximately 20 volunteer fire fighters.

Emergency Services / Equipment:

Greenview Fire_Rescue Services (GFRS) has three fire stations, #31 - DeBolt, #32 - Grovedale and #33 - Grande Cache and two (2) Fire Departments on contract, Fox Creek and Valleyview, each with approximately 20 volunteer fire fighters.

NOTE: The Fire Stations/Fire Departments are not equipped for industrial fire protection and would only be responsible for anything off-site or outside of the Emergency Planning Zone (EPZ). Some Fire Stations/Fire Departments resources may be useful for on-site actions such as water tank trucks, potable water tanks, etc. and may be made available if requested. Certain areas have limited access or are extremely remote from any Fire Stations/Fire Departments.

Alberta Agriculture and Forestry is responsible for wildland fire protection in these areas. The MD of Greenview has four Peace Officers. All policing duties are covered by the RCMP.

Emergency Medical Services are under Alberta Health Services; dial 9-1-1.

Local RCMP Detachments

The local RCMP detachments of Tumbler Ridge, Dawson Creek and Grande Prairie:

- May assist with initial area isolation, evacuation and / or assistance with closure of roads
- Provides security, traffic and crowd control
- May assist in search and rescue activities
- · Maintains law and order

2.1.6.2 External Emergency Response Plans: Local Health Services

2.1.6.2.1 Alberta Health Services

ENVIRONMENTAL PUBLIC HEALTH ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Alberta Health Services (AHS) – Environmental Public Health (EPH) roles and responsibilities in public health emergency preparedness and response to the oil and gas industry are outlined below. The provision of services during an emergency depends upon our assessment of legislative responsibilities, impact to services and business continuity.

EPH will endeavor to:

- Participate with the Licensee in the development of their Emergency Response Plans as it relates to the Environmental Public Health Program's role and responsibility.
- Provide the AHS Zone Single-Point-of-Contact (SPOC) emergency phone number to enable the Licensee to notify
 and alert the Zone of an emergency. From the initial notification or alert, AHS emergency response will fan out to and
 coordinate with other AHS programs and facilities as necessary. 9-1-1 EMS services remain independent of the Zone
 SPOC notification / alert process.
- Participate with stakeholders in preparedness training and exercises associated with a Licensee's simulated activation
 of an Emergency Response Plan in which EPH has a role and responsibility.
- Participate in public information sessions during the Licensee's Emergency Response Plan development process when appropriate and as resources allow.
- Provide guidance to stakeholders and local municipal authorities in identifying sites suitable for establishing and operating an evacuation Centre and / or Reception Centre, including operational requirements.
- Provide guidance to stakeholders on substances that may affect public health in consultation with the Zone Medical Officer of Health (MOH), including Alberta Health Acute Exposure Health Effects for Hydrogen Sulphide and Sulphur Dioxide.
- Conduct assessments, inspections and give regulatory direction, when appropriate, to ensure the requirements of
 provincial legislation and EPH program areas of responsibilities for public health protection and disease prevention
 are maintained.
- Notify the Zone Medical Officer of Health of any incident affecting or potentially affecting other AHS programs or facilities. The Zone MOH will notify and coordinate emergency response in other program areas and facilities as necessary.
- Establish EPH emergency management operations, when appropriate, to support regional response efforts and liaise with the Government Emergency Operations Centre, Municipal Emergency Operations Centre and / or Industry Emergency Operations Centre, if needed.
- Assist the Zone Medical Officer of Health, local municipal authority and Public Information / Communication Officers in the development, issuance and rescinding of public health, public evacuation and shelter-in-place advisories.
- Provide guidance to stakeholders on matters relating to evacuation of the public and / or public facilities and the reoccupancy of those evacuated areas or facilities.
- Record and respond to health complaints or concerns from the public during and following an incident.
- Participate in stakeholder debriefings as necessary.

2.1.6.2 External Emergency Response Plans: Local Health Services (continued)

2.1.6.2.2 HEMBC / Northern Health (NH)

Health Emergency Management BC, North (HEMBC)

HEMBC is a program under the Provincial Health Services Authority (PHSA). HEMBC provides the expertise, education, tools, and support specifically for the BC Health Sector to effectively mitigate, prepare for, respond to, and recover from the impacts of emergency events; ensuring the continuity of health services. There is a HEMBC team in each BC health authority. HEMBC-North deals specifically with Northern Health.

Roles and responsibilities:

- Maintain a 24-hour emergency/on call contact number for notification and activation of the health system in Northern BC
- Notify/activate the appropriate Northern Health programs (i.e. Public Health, Acute Care, etc.) based on the nature
 of the incident/emergency event

Northern Health (NH)

Northern Health is the regional health authority responsible for providing health services to 300,000 people over an area of 600,000 square kilometers in the province of British Columbia. Services include:

- · Acute (hospital) Care
- Public Health (Protection, Preventive and Population Health services)
- Mental Health and Addictions
- Home and Community Care

In the event of a major emergency/disaster, Northern Health will provide health care services within its capacity, and will activate its emergency response management plan(s).

Roles & Responsibilities - PREPAREDNESS (PRE-EVENT):

- Participate with industry, local authority and other partners in the development of their Emergency Response Plans
 as it relates to health authority roles and responsibilities;
- Participate in stakeholder training and exercises associated with activation of an Emergency Response Plan, in which Northern Health or HEMBC have a role and responsibility (as resources allow);

Roles & Responsibilities - RESPONSE:

- Activate internal health emergency management plans related to ongoing provision of services (listed above);
- Provide acute care and emergency services at existing Northern Health hospitals/health centres;
- Work with BC Emergency Health Services (Ambulance) and the BC Patient Transfer Network to transport patients to the appropriate levels of care;
- Apply and enforce the Public Health Act, and associated regulations;
- Provide advice/information to the stakeholders on the existing or potential public health effects of an incident (including drinking water safety, air quality, environmental contaminants, communicable disease prevention, reoccupancy of evacuated areas, etc.);
- Provide advice/information on the best methods for monitoring health effects from an incident;
- Assist in development of (joint) messaging for public information on emergency incidents;
- Provide guidance to stakeholders and local authorities on public health considerations in operating reception and evacuation centres, and group lodging facilities

4.1 NOTIFICATION PROCEDURES

4.1.1 TELEPHONE CALLERS

If an emergency occurs that involves only a few residents within the EPZ, the Public Safety Supervisor will designate Telephone Callers to relay messages of notification, shelter-in-place or evacuation. Refer to the Public Safety Supervisor and Telephone Caller roles in the Corporate ERP for procedures and scripts (Forms 15, 16, 17, and 18).

Once all calls are made, the Public Safety Supervisor will review the contacted public within the EPZ and dispatch Rovers for those who requested assistance or were not reached by the telephone callers.

4.4 SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS FOR EMERGENCY RESPONSE

4.4.1 LOCATING TRANSIENTS AND RECREATIONAL USERS

In an emergency situation, aerial surveillance should be considered for sweeping the area to look for individuals such as non-resident landowners, snowmobilers, hunters, backpackers, skiers or any other recreational transient activity. Helicopters and fixed wing contractors are listed in Contract Services Section under the Site Specific Emergency Contacts Tab in the manual.

NOTE: Helicopters only fly during daylight hours; an emergency situation that happens at night will require the services of the fixed wing company.

4.4.2 ISOLATION OF EPZ PROCEDURES

- The On-Scene Supervisor will initially designate the necessary personnel to secure all entrances into the incident site and only allow access to authorized personnel. All personnel who are allowed entry will be briefed on the existing conditions and must be equipped with the appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).
- Cleared pipeline rights-of-way will be temporarily isolated to restrict access using isolation measures as determined at the time of the incident. Consider the use of aerial surveillance, traffic control / roadblock personnel or area rovers.

- Designated personnel will follow the Roadblock Personnel role checklist in the Emergency Response Guide or this
 manual to provide initial EPZ isolation. Ideally, authorization from the local authority and / or the RCMP should be
 obtained before establishing roadblocks on public roads.
- The Incident Commander will ensure notification and consultation with appropriate regulatory authorities and the RCMP or local police
- For longer term road closures, SMS 6.88 Traffic Control procedure should be used to ensure safe and proper control
 measures.
