

Forest Fire at Cold Lake Air Weapons Range (CLAWR)

May 25, 9:00am

Canadian Natural continues to work together with officials from Alberta Environment and Resource Development, Department of National Defence, and local officials during their ongoing management of the forest fire in the CLAWR. We appreciate and thank the many emergency responders who are battling the forest fires and their dedication and hard work towards protecting the safety of people and infrastructure in the area.

All workers evacuated from Canadian Natural's Primrose Operations on May 23rd are safe, accounted for, and have no reported injuries. As a result of the precautionary and temporary shutdown of facilities and pipelines in the CLAWR, Canadian Natural's crude oil production at Kirby South thermal in situ operations has been reduced by 18,000 bbl/day to approximately 12,000 bbl/day. The reduced output at Kirby South is in addition to the temporarily shut in volumes at Primrose of approximately 80,000 bbl/day of production. Once safe access to the CLAWR is permitted, Canadian Natural will assess our operations and determine the next steps to return to full operations accordingly.

In response to the forest fire in the Cold Lake Air Weapons Range (CLAWR) in northeastern Alberta, Canadian Natural Resources Limited (Canadian Natural) has taken precautionary measures to protect the safety of our people and our assets. Canadian Natural has evacuated workers within areas of our Primrose thermal in situ operations and completed the safe, temporary shut-in of 70,000 bbl/d of crude oil production. Canadian Natural is working together with the Department of National Defence (DND) at CLAWR to ensure the safe and orderly movement of people through the area. All workers are safe and accounted for with no reported injuries.
